Financing has been approved and most all of the contracts have been signed. By the time you get this newsletter, an introductory meeting with Attic Angel Management and maintenance personnel will have happened.

Because of the financing with Starion Bank and our agreement with them, each resident was to be assessed \$100 per month to our maintenance fee for capital outlay. Because of the generous response of the majority of residents dropping their life leases to 85% payout, Starion has agreed to begin an increase of \$50 on July 1st through the end of the year. Starting January 1st, 2022, an additional \$50 will be assessed. This will give residents an opportunity to adjust. Great

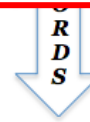

“Today in my class, I taught Romantic music (19th c) which centered on Beethoven. He completely lost his hearing and lived with this for 20 years. Yet he wrote magnificent symphonies completely deaf. As I spoke of the writing of his 5th symphony, I had this odd feeling that I was talking about myself, and all of us, trying to come to terms with what life hands us.

Each of the four movements is working through the tragedy of his loss of hearing. The first movement is musical rage at God for the unfairness of it all; the second movement is slow, conveying a profound grief; the third is a majestic pulling yourself together; the finale is accepting his infirmity and deepening his relationship with God. He used his illness as a creative way to produce a magnificent piece of music.
