

### **Board of Directors**

1. CFO John Kaiser and Bill Toman have joined the finance committee. The budget process for 2022 will begin in October.
2. Resident requested condo renovations will not be considered until the 2023 budget cycle.
3. A temporary fee of \$75/mo. will be assessed if more than two people are living in a condo. Further evaluation is taking place on this issue.
4. For the safety of residents, there will be a 20-pound weight limit on new dogs, except for service dogs.
5. Due to unwanted animals, bird feeders will only be allowed Nov. 1st - Mar. 31st.

## Understanding Why Feeding Birds in Summer is Prohibited

OVI allows bird feeders from November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>. Supplemental feeding in warmer weather is not necessary when natural food sources are abundant. Feeding wild birds in summer is associated with negative impacts such as disease transmission, death from window strikes and attracting geese and rodents.

## Attract More Pollinators Instead

Pollinators are nearly as important as sunlight, soil and water to the reproductive success of over 75% of the world's flowering plants. They are crucial to the production of most fruits, nuts, and berries on which people and wildlife depend. Below are a list of flowers that will attract butterflies to your garden:
