Board of Directors

- 1. The full board did not meet in August.
- 2. We have just learned that the IRS has determined that we are a non-profit. We will continue the additional processing with the city and state.
- 3. **Treasury Report** The news is very good. In total, we borrowed \$1.5 M based on a fixed \$ 600,000 loan and a "cash draw" \$900,000 loan. At the end of July, we owe \$592,086 on the fixed and \$512,400 on

the cash draw. The even better part is that with the potential sales over the next several months, it is very likely that the remaining \$512,400 on the cash draw will be paid off! That's quite a feat and helps our debt situation enormously. The other good news is that our monthly cash flow is showing a regular positive of just over \$5,000. We need more operational months to see how this holds up. But a very good start none the less.
