Living Safely

The safety of the village residents is a major concern of the Olympic Village Incorporated (OVI) board. Therefore, as the secretary of the board, I will periodically be writing a safety column. Having worked in chemical laboratories and on the railroad, I have had a variety of experiences with safety matters. This month we will look at outside holiday decorating.

Let's consider three safety issues. The first two are electrical safety and trip hazards. These are related in the village, particularly during the holiday season. (*Continued on Page 4*) To reduce the chances of people stumbling and falling outside their units, each unit has four exterior lights to illuminate the garage area and the entrance sidewalk. White bulbs should be used in these fixtures, and they should be on any time that people are expected to come to the unit after dark. These fixtures are not designed to hold additional weight, so please do not use them for hanging decorations. Additional weight may loosen the fixtures, creating a path for moisture and insects into the building. Over time it may also cause the internal wiring to deteriorate.

A second electrical and trip concern is the electrical cords used for outdoor lighting. Most electrical cords are not safe to use outdoors. Please only use cords that are rated for outdoor use. You do not want fires, shorts, and electrocutions to become part of your holiday tradition. Electricity in a damp environment can be quite shocking. For the same reason, if you use outdoor timers, be sure that they are properly rated and are protected from the weather.

Electrical cords are also a trip hazard. Therefore, the village prohibits the lighting of trees and bushes outside a unit's planting area. The lawns of the village can be crossed by anyone at any time and should not be obstructed by cords. Even around your own unit, please be very careful with the placement of electrical cords. You may know where they are and always step over them, but visitors and friends may not know and trip over them. Because falls are a major cause of health deterioration in senior citizens, we must all work to prevent them.

Finally, when you lived in a residential neighborhood, you might have liked to attract attention to your home by having a spectacular holiday display. Keeping all of us safe means not doing that in Olympic Village. Because pedestrian and vehicle traffic share the same narrow street in the village, we do not want to encourage extra traffic. Second, we do not want to attract visitors to the village whose intentions are less than honorable, such as home invaders and car thieves. The village therefore desires you to keep your holiday displays modest, for example, no blowup figures, no flashing lights (a mild twinkle is okay), and no projections.

The OVI board wishes you a happy and safe holiday season.
