Living Safely

Spring has come, and it is time to shake off the winter lethargy and get outside for some exercise. While some of you may garden and have other strenuous hobbies, anyone who has any mobility should at least get out and walk. No need to be ashamed of your canes and walkers. We are all growing older, and physical impairments are frequently a component of aging. The OVI board has worked to make walking safer by getting the city of Sun Prairie to prohibit bicycle traffic on the sidewalk on the village side of Hunters Trail all the way to O'Keefe. Walking around the village on the internal roadway gives you a chance to get exercise and to meet your fellow villagers. Take your time; you have the right-of-way on the roadway. However, do try to stay as visible as possible and give drivers room to get around you.

Our internal roadway is shared by pedestrians and vehicles. When you operate a vehicle, remember that you have a responsibility to the rest of the members of the community to help keep them safe. First, this means obeying the village's 10 mph speed limit. It will take you a few seconds longer to get to your unit, but you will greatly reduce the chances of having the enduring guilt of having hit and injured one of your neighbors. Second, keep your vehicles in your garage as much as possible. As the village roadway gets busier with pedestrians and vehicles in the warmer weather, keeping obstructions to visibility to a minimum is essential to preventing accidents. We can't always see as well as we think we can. My 25-year-old granddaughter, a very experienced driver, died when she pulled out directly in front of a cement mixer that the witnesses agreed she could not have missed seeing, but she did.
