#15 Gardens/Plantings: Planting flowers in boxes or containers on the patio is allowed and encouraged. Please use natural materials such as clay pots for patios plantings. Please do not plant vegetables in pots or in the ground. If you have any special landscape or gardening plans or requests, please submit your proposal in writing to RCM, Janelle Taylor for approval.

#46 No artificial flowers are to be displayed outside your residence.
