WINDOW WASHING INFORMATION

Our resident Window Washers are trained and ready to go. Olympic Village has purchased professional equipment for this project. There are 2 teams of 5 that will be working together, so once they start it will go quite fast.

The scheduled date to start washing the outside windows is Friday, June 21st starting at 7am. Screens need to be removed prior to that. If your screens are not removed, your windows will not be washed.

The South end of the Village units 942-998 may be washed sooner. There is nothing scheduled that could get in the way such as new roofs. Residents getting their windows washed will be notified and so will Jim if he needs to remove the screens. Note: Units 832-838; 882-888 and 892-898 will not be washed until the new roofs are completed.

There may be some early start dates if time permits. These units will be notified.
