Unit 944 renovations are almost completed. The wait list is down to 38 names. The unit is being shown.

A lot of activity going on at the corner of Hunters Trail and O'Keefe. Many trees and bushes have been removed. New plants and trees will be planted as quickly as possible. We ask for your patience please.

The landscape committee is TRYING <u>humane</u> ways to keep the geese from enjoying the grassy area around the ponds. Last year the geese and cranes ate more than one half of the grass seed that was put down in the area by the parking lot. What they are trying is putting garden stakes with two rows of sixty pound fishing string around the edge of the pond by the side of the club house. The idea is the geese fly into the pond and then wander up on the land. The hope is, they will not like getting tangled in the string and stay off the grass and the walkways, patios and parking lot.

Here is an article from the August **2021** Voice that explains the reason we don't allow feeding the birds during the summer months.

#### UNDERSTANDING WHY FEEDING BIRDS IN SUMMER IS PROHIBITED

OVI allows bird feeders from November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>. Supplemental feeding in warmer weather is not necessary when natural food sources are abundant. Feeding wild birds in summer is associated with negative impacts such as disease transmission, death from window strikes and, attracting geese and rodents.

Another item, from the August 2021 Voice; there was a reminder for August 10<sup>th</sup> 2021 OV Independence Day Cookout. This is a reminder that the OV Celebration of Independence started in 2021. So, that makes this year our 5th Celebration. The name was changed last year to the Preservation Day Celebration but everything else is the same, the Plaza Burger, Brats, etc. It's still a great reminder what OV has accomplish after the departure of Independent Living and we became Olympic Village Inc.

**Safety Reminder:** If you don't have grab bars in your shower or tub area, it would be in your best interest to have some installed. You would need to purchase them, and then complete a work order for Jim to install.

**REMINDER:** This is something that is held all summer long weather permitting. Dianne Schultz wants to remind everyone the **Tree Gathering has started now.** Everyone is invited to come and sit under the berry trees and visit with your neighbors. The location is down by the Dead- End sign on the south end of Olympic Village 928 Hunters Trail.
