VILLAGE SCOOP

Don't forget we have a drop off for donations to the food pantry. It is located on your right as you enter the clubhouse. This remains in place year-round.

There is a signup sheet on the bulletin board for anyone interested in helping with clubhouse security. Contact Dave Mischka if you wish to know more about this opportunity.

A reminder that in the event of emergencies such as frozen pipes, sewer backup, water leaks, heating or cooling issues, electrical problems, etc., call OV Maintenance at 608-400-5126.

Remember, there is a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board to host the monthly coffee and donuts. The host picks up the donuts and may submit the receipt for reimbursement. They also prepare the coffee, set up the donuts, and put out paper plates and napkins. The coffee, tea, and paper goods are part of the inventory maintained by OVRA.

A note from Jim Wickert regarding the envelope project:

- As siding is removed, there will be a lot of pounding on outside walls to determine if there are areas of rot. There have been reports of pictures falling off walls and articles being knocked off shelves. Any items that are not securely mounted should be removed from outside walls when siding is being removed including garage walls
- There will be some vehicle congestion. Take care when you get back out of the driveway.
- Resident's electricity was used for saws, pneumatic tools, microwave, etc. There was only a \$2.50 difference between our electric bill for that period vs. the same time period in 2024. It is a small price to pay to not have to listen to a commercial generator running outside your unit.
- If you have security cameras, lights, etc. installed on the exterior of your unit, you may want to remove them before the project begins. Or, if the construction crew removes them, you may want to ask that they give them to you to store so that none of the parts are lost.

SEASONAL RULES OF RESIDENCY

Emergencies such as frozen pipes, sewer backup, heat or air-conditioning malfunction during extreme temperatures, electrical problems, etc., will be prioritized by maintenance staff.

When it is necessary for maintenance staff to enter your unit to perform routine scheduled maintenance, you will be notified at least 24 hours in advance. When notified, indicate if the maintenance staff has permission to enter your unit if you are not home.

When there is a maintenance emergency, an Olympic Village representative may enter your unit without the Resident being present or notified.

The bulk of our snow removal is done by an outside contractor. If you have a special need for snow removal, please call the office.



Missing Folding Chairs – Request for Return




