SEASONAL RULES OF RESIDENCY

With spring around the corner, it is a good time to re-visit a few rules in the Olympic Village Residency Rules.

Bird feeders are permitted but should only be filled November 1 through March 31. From April 1 through October 31, the feeders must be removed or remain empty. However, Hummingbird or Baltimore Oriole feeders may be hung with no more than two feeders per unit.

The feeding of ducks, geese or any wild animals is prohibited in Olympic Village.

Planting flowers in containers on the back patio and front entryway is permitted and encouraged. No artificial flowers can be displayed outside. Vegetables and herbs may be planted in up to three portable pots on the back patio. No plants or flowers are permitted along driveways or around mailboxes. If you have special landscape or gardening plans that deviate from this standard, submit your proposal in writing to the Residential Community Manager (Derek Buckley).
